### Phoenix Class

Phoenix Class have had a fantastic first week back, with our trip to Seaton being a real highlight. We enjoyed a sunny ride on the tram, taking in the beautiful views of the wetlands and spotting a variety of birds along the way. At the Discovery Centre, the children took part in a range of exciting dinosaur-themed activities. They especially loved using spades and brushes to dig through the sand and uncover different fossils. The dinosaur exhibition was a big hit too, with lots of moving - and very noisy - dinosaurs to explore. We even had the opportunity to look at and handle a fascinating collection of real fossils, including dinosaur poo, which caused plenty of giggles!

### Gryphon Class

We have made a great start to our new History topic on Ancient Civilisations. The children have been learning about the key features that define a civilisation and are beginning to develop their understanding of early societies and how they were organised.

In English, we have started a new text called Varmints. This imaginative story has really captured the children's interest and has already inspired some thoughtful discussions, as well as creative responses in their reading.

In science we put vertebrate animals into their 5 main groups - mammals, reptiles, birds, amphibians and fish based on the features of each group. We also used venn diagrams from our maths to sort animals based on observable features. We are starting our new Christianity RE unit by looking at different kinds of love including agape, selfless love, to begin looking at answering the question: 'What was significant about how Jesus treated people and what impact has that had on the world today?'
