- *Due to a lack of swimming from 2020-2022 our % of Y6 children able to swim 25m with a recognisable stroke was 0%. However, all Y6 children could swim 25m using a range of strokes and doggy paddle to achieve the distance*
- **For 2022-2023 67% of our Year 6 children achieved swimming 25m using a range of strokes.**
- Our range of clubs on offer increased, despite significant staff shortages, in our isolated rural areas, across both schools; Gymnastics, Football, Mixed sports including Archery and Tae Kwon Do were provided
- Several PE curricular / schemes investigated to enhance PE provision for 2022 – 2023. Real PE selected for whole school implementation for 1/9/22
- Successful Sports “Fest” festival held for both Federation Schools to give taster sessions in a range of minority sports and creating small games
- Cricket Coaching from Somerset CCC implemented in both schools and links provided to our local cricket club to all parents for out of school clubs/provision
- Several children have accessed local football, tag rugby, gymnastics and a local dance club
- New fixed goal post/basketball posts have been fitted in our playground. This has enhanced playtimes and the new basketball hoops have widened the range of play activities.

- Confidence and self-esteem in swimming remains a significant issue and will take time to overcome
- Development of playground spaces to provide a greater range of play opportunities for a wider range of children.

- Increase range of outdoor and adventurous activities
- Wider range of sports equipment available.
